3-day Seminar: Understanding the Distressed Behaviour of People with Dementia in Hong Kong

Jockey Club Centre for Positive Ageing and University of Worcester jointly organize this three-day seminar on "Understanding the Distressed Behavior of People with Dementia in Hong Kong".

The aim of this seminar is to help professional staff understand the integrative approach for supporting people with dementia and their family caregivers in the management of distressed behaviours (Behavioral and Psychological Symptoms of Dementia, BPSD). It is expected that the participants will be able to:

- 1. Understand person-centred care approach of dementia care and acquire knowledge of managing distressed behaviour
- 2. Explore the reasons and care strategy of distressed behaviours through different professional perspectives
- 3. Interpret the assessment tools and intervention protocols
- 4. Take into consideration the voices of people with dementia and their family members for promoting a proper caring attitude
